These tutoring programs prioritize math, literacy, and other foundational learning skills and are intended to promote learning recovery and to help address achievement and skills development gaps. In addition, these programs will support learning in a trusted environment grounded in the language, culture, and community norms for students.

African-Canadian Coalition against Hate, Oppression & Racism (ANCHOR) (formerly Vaughan African Canadian Association)

Description: We are committed to supporting York Region students who identify as Black, African or Caribbean by offering free tutoring for students who require additional academic tutoring outside of the regular school day. We offer in-person and virtual tutoring using a 1:1 model for students who require intensive support and small group tutoring for those who would benefit from a small group approach. We also offer French tutoring for students in French immersion in grades 1-10 and literacy and math for students in Kindergarten to grade twelve.



Jump Math!

JUMP Math is an individualized tutoring program for students aged 8-14 who are performing a minimum of one year behind in the area of math due to a diagnosed, identified, or suspected math disability (dyscalculia), and who are showing signs of math anxiety.

Participants work in small groups (4) with a trained numeracy tutor to build foundational math skills and computational fluency. Sessions are taught using a combination of direct instruction and engaging math games and activities. Participants are also able to set goals and visualize their progress throughout the program in order to foster math confidence.

Program will be offered virtually and/or in person. locations to be determined based on demand.

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Reading Rocks!

Reading Rocks is an individualized reading intervention program designed by Brock University's Dr. John McNamara, who specializes in Learning Disabilities. This program is designed for students aged 8-14 who are performing a minimum of one year behind in the area of literacy due to a diagnosed, identified, or suspected reading disability (dyslexia).

In addition to foundational literacy skills, Reading Rocks is an intervention approach that uses motivational tactics to engage children in the reading process. These tactics are designed to actively engage children in their own learning. The motivation tactics are engaged through the use of instructional workstations that tutors design and tailor to each child's needs.

The Reading Rocks approach is designed to be delivered in a series of 1-hour instructional sessions.

1 hour twice a week for 8 weeks.

Play Forever - Play Forever Tutor Program

Description: 1 to 1 virtual tutoring service based on individual student needs in Math, English, Science and French.

Target Audience: Ages 6-18. A majority of students come from underserved and marginalized communities, single parent families and newcomers, as we seek to provide subsidized tutoring services all year round.


